A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 8 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to waste
- 2 management, so as to prohibit plastic bags and food service disposable containers that are
- 3 composed of polystyrene foam; to provide for exemptions; to provide for enforcement and
- 4 fines; to provide for a hotline and form to report violations; to provide for definitions; to
- 5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 8 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to waste
- 9 management, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:

10 "<u>ARTICLE 10</u>

- 11 <u>12-8-250.</u>
- 12 As used in this article, the term:
- 13 (1) 'Food sales establishment' shall have the same meaning as set forth in Code
- 14 <u>Section 26-2-21.</u>
- 15 (2) 'Food service establishment' shall have the same meaning as set forth in Code
- 16 <u>Section 26-2-370.</u>
- 17 (3) 'Reusable checkout bag' means a bag with handles that is specifically designed and
- manufactured for multiple reuse and is made of cloth, fiber, or other machine-washable
- 19 <u>fabric</u>.
- 20 (4) 'Single-use carryout bag' means a bag made of plastic and provided by a food sales
- 21 <u>establishment, food service establishment, or retail store at the point of sale for the</u>
- 22 purpose of transporting merchandise.

- 24 (a) On or after July 1, 2022, except as provided in subsection (c) of this Code section, no
- 25 <u>food sales establishment, food service establishment, or retail store shall provide or sell to</u>
- 26 <u>any customer, at the point of sale, a single-use carryout bag.</u>
- 27 (b) If a customer does not have a reusable checkout bag at the point of sale, the food sales
- 28 <u>establishment, food service establishment, or retail store shall provide to the customer bags</u>
- 29 made of paper and charge to the customer a fee of at least 10¢ for every \$25.00 worth of
- 30 merchandise purchased, if the purchase amount is over \$25.00, or, at the customer's
- 31 request, the customer may carry out merchandise without a paper bag. If the fee is charged,
- 32 such fee may be retained by the food sales establishment, food service establishment, or
- 33 retail store. This subsection shall not apply to customers participating in the Supplemental
- 34 <u>Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or the Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)</u>
- 35 program.
- 36 (c) The following bags shall be exempt from this Code section:
- 37 (1) Plastic produce bags;
- 38 (2) Deli counter meat bags;
- 39 (3) Bulk food bags;
- 40 (4) Dry-cleaning garment bags;
- 41 (5) Newspaper bags; and
- 42 (6) Trash bags.
- 43 12-8-252.
- 44 (a) On or after July 1, 2022, no food sales establishment or food service establishment
- 45 <u>shall provide or sell to any customer, at the point of sale, food or beverages in or on any</u>
- 46 <u>disposable container that is composed in whole or in part of polystyrene foam.</u>
- 47 (b) The following disposable containers shall be exempt from this Code section:
- 48 (1) Meat and seafood containers; and
- 49 <u>(2) Egg cartons.</u>
- 50 <u>12-8-253.</u>
- 51 (a) The Department of Agriculture and all county boards of health and their duly
- 52 <u>authorized agents are authorized to enforce compliance with this article.</u>
- 53 (b) Any food sales establishment, food service establishment, or retail store found to be
- 54 <u>in violation of this article shall be subject to the following penalties:</u>
- 55 (1) For a first violation, a warning shall be issued to the violator;
- 56 (2) For a second violation, a fine of no less than \$50.00 and no more than \$250.00; and

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57 (3) For a third or subsequent violation, a fine of no less than \$250.00 and no more than

- 58 <u>\$500.00.</u>
- 59 (c) Each point-of-sale transaction in violation of this article shall be considered a separate
- 60 <u>violation.</u>
- 61 (d) The Department of Natural Resources shall provide a hotline telephone number on its
- 62 website and develop and make available for download from its website a model form to
- 63 report violations of this article. Such hotline shall be under the direction of the Department
- 64 of Natural Resources."

65 SECTION 2.

66 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
